# DESCENDANTS OF ABRAHAM BLUMIN FAMILY REUNION COLLINGWOOD/ BLUE MOUNTAIN ONTARIO CANADA ON BEAUTIFUL GEORGIAN BAY JULY 3-6, 2014

Dear Cousins and Extended Family Members:

Please consider this to be your official invitation to join together at the fifth (renamed) **Baker-Blumin-Passin-Robinov Family Reunion** to be held in Collingwood/ Blue Mountain Ontario on the shores of scenic Georgian Bay in Ontario, Canada from Thursday July 3 to Sunday July 6<sup>th</sup> (3-6) 2014. A registration form is enclosed with this mailing. We ask that everyone please complete and return the form even if you are unable to attend the Reunion.

For those who may be unfamiliar with the history of our Family Reunion, here's some brief background. About eleven years ago, we polled several relatives from a list compiled by cousin **Sylva Baker**, our official Family Genealogist, to see whether there was interest in holding a family reunion. Working with a limited number of names and addresses, Howard Baker and his committee organized a wonderful reunion in Lake Buena Vista, Florida in late June 2004 that was attended by more than 60 relatives from 11 states, Canada, France and The Netherlands. The amazing spirit and warm feelings that highlighted the Florida reunion led us to hold another in San Diego in June 2006 where nearly 100 family members from infants to super seniors enjoyed a most wonderful gathering. Our third reunion in June 2009 was held in Scottsdale where we once again enjoyed a warm family feeling that matched Arizona's summer temperature. In July 2012, approximately 60 of us visited Kent Island on Chesapeake Bay for our fourth reunion and everyone had a great time catching up once again. And with that in mind, we are looking forward to another great event in several months, where we can again experience the special feeling and sentiment that only a family reunion can generate.

At the final family dinner in Kent Island, we asked for feedback on frequency of the next reunion(s) and location. The majority felt that the next reunion should take place in two years instead of the historical three; and, it appeared that there was overwhelming interest among the Family in holding the next reunion in Canada.

So, with some persuasion, the Canadian cousins present agreed to take on the task of organizing the next reunion on the condition that Cousin Howard remain involved as Consultant; and that an Organizing Committee be selected representing the varied age/interest cross section of the Family. We are pleased to report that after some email communication with the Committee, along with discussions in some informal family gettogether, we have finalized the location and have some exciting Reunion details to share with the Group.

### BLUE MOUNTAIN "VILLAGE SUITES" & "INN"

Our 2014 Reunion will be held outside of Collingwood Ontario in the Town of Blue Mountains, a resort community located approximately 90 minutes north of Toronto. We have selected two Hotel Facilities that are part of the same "Resort Complex" and between them, should appeal to everyone in our Group.

Attached is a "Resort Conference Map" which can be used as a reference for booking purposes. You will note that there are two "Accommodation Check In" spots; one being the Grand Georgian which is to be used for the "Village Suite Accommodation" and the other, is for the "Blue Mountain Inn" room option.

To make booking your rooms easier, we have also enclosed a "Reservation booking information" sheet which has all of the information necessary to book your rooms - including booking reference number, online booking procedure, rates and room information. We encourage you to go on line or call the listed toll free information and speak with a representative who should be able to answer all of your specific accommodation questions.

Doug and Joan Moody, who are part of the Core Committee, have booked a 3 bedroom suite in the "Village Suites" building "Weider Lodge" which they plan to make available as a hospitality area for the Group during the Reunion so if you are choosing the "Village Suites" as your accommodation, you may want to request "Weider Lodge" to ensure that you are close to the rest of the Family and to the hospitality room.

#### **Travel Information**

The Town of Blue Mountains is a 4-seasons resort Community located outside of Collingwood Ontario on the shores of beautiful Georgian Bay forming part of the Great Lakes. The Resort is approximately 90 minutes north of Pearson Airport in Toronto, which would be the closest Airport and offer the most number of flight choices for those travelling from the States and other parts of the world. There are a number of shuttle options available as well as all of the Major Car Rental Companies operate out of Pearson and details of these options will be made available at a later date. Another alternative to Pearson is Billy Bishop Island Airport located in downtown Toronto. Porter Airlines is the exclusive airline for this airport and has reasonable costs for flights to many American cities, especially on the east coast and Chicago. The drawback of this downtown airport is that it could add another 30 minutes of travel time to the Reunion and shuttle arrangements may be more difficult and expensive. However, if you are planning to spend some time in Toronto before or after the reunion, then this might be the perfect option for you. Alternatively, you could consider flying in and out of the Buffalo Airport (it is actually the Niagara Falls Airport) and rent a car from there. Southwest has many daily flights and is typically a cheaper airline on which to fly. This would allow

you to visit Niagara Falls on your way to Toronto and Collingwood. The additional travel time from the Niagara Falls Airport to Toronto is approximately 90 minutes. When making your airline reservations, please bear in mind that our reunion begins on Thursday July 3<sup>rd</sup> and our first "official" event will be an opening reception and dinner probably beginning about 6 pm. And, on Sunday morning July 6, beginning about 8:00 am we plan to have a closing breakfast followed by a family meeting. We should conclude by 9:30 or 10 am.

## **Our Reunion Plans**

Reunion planning is still "on-going" but we expect to follow the same format that has worked well at our prior gatherings. A final program agenda will be provided to everyone a few weeks before the reunion but here's a preview of what we anticipate: We will begin on Thursday afternoon, July 3, with registration and hospitality sign-in to be followed by an opening reception, welcome dinner and a family meeting . . . Friday's dinner will be held at a private banquet room in the Village Conference Centre and Saturday's dinner will culminate with a Sunset Dinner Cruise on beautiful Georgian Bay . As noted above, Sunday's closing breakfast will be held on the Resort premises and include a wrap up family meeting.

Varied morning activities will be planned for Friday and Saturday. Cousins Cindy and Julie Baker will be asked to once again lead a wake-up walk/run along part of the Niagara Escarpment, which affords gorgeous views of the Georgian Bay. On Friday morning we're again planning a Family Golf Outing at the Monterra Golf Course, which is located on the Resort Premises. If golf isn't your thing, we have arranged for a Group to attend the Scandavia Spa which is a fully equipped spa filled with hot and cold pools, steam, saunas, quiet rooms and of course treatment rooms for all types of body pampering. For the younger Family Members there are a myriad of activities including Zip lining, scenic caves, mountain roller coaster, mini-put and many other activities.

The plan is for Friday morning to be filled with planned activities as noted above and the afternoon will be at leisure at the Hotel pool and/or beach, which will allow family members to relax and get caught up. We have a banquet room booked at the Village Conference Centre for our Friday night dinner, which we hope will include our usual sing song and story telling along with a great meal.

With no shortage of activities in the Blue Mountain resort area, we will offer a choice of activities on Saturday morning that are TBA. After more pool/beach/leisure time in the afternoon, we will depart for Midland Ontario via bus and board the "Miss Midland" Cruise ship where we will commandeer the entire ship for an evening of fun, food, and fellowship. Three hours of cruising the islands of Georgian Bay feasting on a delicious buffet with our own family entertainment will no doubt be one of the highlights of the Event.

While we hope everyone will participate in one way or another in the planned reunion events, we recognize family members may want to go off and do their own thing, which is fine. We ask only that everyone please attend all the dinner meals and family meetings.

## **The Reunion Cost**

We are mindful of the need to keep Reunion costs as reasonable as possible and in this regard, we are pleased to advise that we are reducing the price per adult to \$195.00 (down from \$250.00, and less for children under ages 14 and 4) and this includes all evening meals, snacks, commemorative mementos, transportation to/from reunion events and related admission/use charges. Fri and Sat breakfasts, Luncheons, greens fees and the Spa and other optional activities will be extra.
